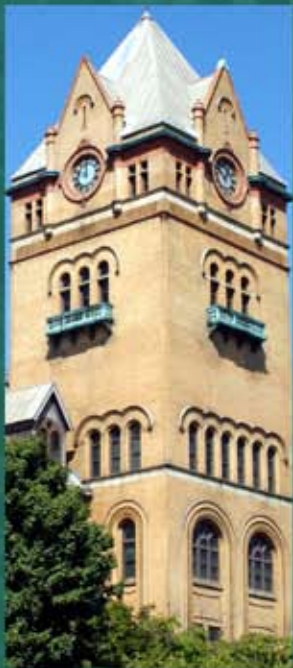

Sue Nine

Sue Nine began her association with Wayne State University as a freshman in Fall 1958. Sue and her future husband, Paul, met as members of WSU's nationally prominent debate program. She and Paul graduated in 1962 and have been a part of the Wayne State family ever since.



A long time friend to the University, Sue has supported for the College of Fine, Performing and Communication Arts (CFPCA) since its formation in 1986. She served as President of the Understudies (the group of dedicated volunteers who support the Hilberry Theatre) for five years. Under her leadership, the Understudies increased its fund-raising results substantially. She has also served as Vice President of the Choreographers, the volunteer group for the Maggie Allesee Department of Dance. She is a Past Chair of the Anthony Wayne Society and currently sits of the Board of that group. She has participated on several key WSU search committees and is currently Chair of the CFPCA Board of Visitors on which she has served since 2000.

Sue is well known for her volunteer work in the wider Detroit Metropolitan community. She has been honored by the National Kidney Foundation of Michigan, has been active in the March of Dimes, SE Michigan chapter, the American Lung Association of SE Michigan, the Women's Division for Project HOPE, the Michigan Cancer Foundation, the Women's Association for the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, and the International Visitors Council of Metropolitan Detroit Inc. among others. She is currently President of the Visiting Nurses Association, President of the Women's Survival Center in Oakland County, and Secretary of the local American Red Cross. Sue has chaired innumerable fund raising events to benefit the community. Both Sue and Paul Nine were honored in 2003 for 20 years of service as board members of the Boys and Girls Clubs.
